DESIGNATED HORSE AREAS

Competitors and handlers are to ensure that all Horses are to remain in designated horse areas, these are the main arena, Bicentennial Equestrian Park, rodeo parking area, the rodeo arena, mini horse ring and horse lane. Any competitors (horses) found to be outside the designated areas will be reported to the head steward and may be disqualified from competition.

BICYCLES, SCOOTERS AND OTHER UNREGISTERED VEHICLES

For the period of the Camden Show from Friday Morning 6:00 am until 11:00 pm on Saturday night all bicycles, scooters, Electric Scooters or other ridden vehicles are to be excluded from any horse areas. This includes the main arena, Bicentennial Equestrian Park, rodeo parking area and the rodeo arena, the horse access lane and any areas where horses are kept or travelling. Anyone found in possession of this equipment will be required to remove it from the area immediately.

RULES

Hendra Virus: Due to the serious nature of the Hendra Virus, the Camden Show Society and the RAS recommends that all horses be vaccinated against the disease.

PIC Numbers: As of 1st September 2012, people with horses on their property need to apply for a Property Identification Code - this is a biosecurity measure. PICs are assigned to individual properties and allocated by Local Land Service who maintain the register. You may already have a PIC if you pay rates to LLS. Forms can be submitted online through http://www.lls.nsw.gov.au/livestock/pics. Every Exhibitor bringing horses to the Show will be required to list each horse being shown together with the PIC for the property from which it has come on the

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waiver form each day before competing. Waivers now also include a competitor declaration that "to the best of their knowledge each horse listed is fit and healthy". These rules shall apply in their entirety to any person who is a competitor/ handler/owner or person responsible, for any horse that is in attendance at the 2025 Camden Show. It is the responsibility of all persons forementioned to ensure that he/she is familiar with these rules. It is the absolute responsibility of those persons to participate in accordance with these rules. Infringement of any rule will result in the Camden Show Society Inc. imposing disciplinary action against the offender which may result in the person/s being excluded from the Show/Competition.

Competitors are advised that at times multiple disciplines may compete in the same area including working horse classes, harness classes, driven classes and show jumping. All competitors/handlers/owner or persons responsible compete and/or handle horses at their own risk. The Camden Show Society Inc. accepts NO responsibility for any injury, death, loss to any person (competitor or spectator), livestock or property that may occur during the course of this event. In the interests of safety and event management all competitors and animal handlers are required to act on all reasonable directives by stewards, show officials and judges immediately.

Refusal of Entry/Alteration of Schedule: The committee reserves the right to refuse an entry without assigning any reason for doing so and to alter the schedule to meet emerging circumstances.

Conduct: The Camden Show horse events are staffed entirely by Volunteers without whom it would not be possible to hold the Show, so it is important that they are treated with the respect they deserve. Accordingly, the Camden Show Committee would like to advise competitors and their supporters of the following: rudeness and improper behaviour by competitors or their representatives will not be tolerated. Camden Show Volunteers, Stewards and Ticket Box staff have the right to refuse service to any competitor who is rude or abusive. This includes the right to refuse to issue insurance waivers and wristbands and entry tickets. Competitors who have been refused either wristbands or entry tickets are ineligible to compete at the Camden Show on either Friday or Saturday. Competitors or their supporters who behave in a rude or offensive manner while in or around the Show arenas will be asked to leave the arena or area and may be subject to further disciplinary action according to the Camden Show Society's Horse Committee Rules and Regulations. All entry forms, waivers and official paperwork must be filled in legibly and correctly for every Exhibit prior to entry, the Show may refuse entry or disqualify competitors if errors or omissions are identified regardless of competition being completed. The Show reserves the right to alter results including re-awarding prizes in the event of a disqualification after competition has concluded.

Competitor Numbering: All competitors will be assigned a unique number for use when recording competition results, all competitors are to complete a competitor nomination sheet providing the details for each rider and horse to be handed in to the ticket office. The ticket office will assign a unique number for each competitor which the rider or handler must present when requested during competition. All details on the form must be entered correctly and in legible handwriting, failure to complete all of the details or messy handwriting may result in competition results not being forwarded to the relevant parties after the Show. In the event that competitors details are un-useable Camden Show reserves the right to alter the results accordingly.

Event Tickets Online Purchases: Tickets for the 2025 Camden Show Horse Competition may be pre-purchased online through nominate at www.nominate.com.au, insurance waivers and competitor number sheets can be downloaded from the same site or www.camdenshow.com. Tickets are to be picked up at the ticket box in the Bicentennial Equestrian Park on the day of the Show. Insurance waivers and competitor numbers can also be handed in for processing when picking up tickets.

Event Tickets on Show Days: On payment of entry fees, event tickets can be purchased at the Horse Entry Booth. One ticket is required for each individual event. Event tickets will be collected by the ring Stewards for each event in the ring. Only competitors with event tickets will be eligible to compete in any event.

Participants Indemnity and Waiver: Any person in any area of the Camden Show Ground who is responsible for or in control of a horse, specifically, all competitors/guardians/handlers and any other persons entering the Main Arena, the Bicentennial Equestrian Park Competition Arena, the Rodeo Arena or any other area within the bounds of the Showground and Bicentennial Equestrian Park, must sign an Indemnity and Waiver issued by the Agricultural Societies Council of New South Wales for each day of the Show. This form will be available prior to the Show at www.camdenshow.com and on the day at the Horse Section ticket booth and must be filled in prior to purchase of event tickets. Upon returning a signed Indemnity and Waiver a wrist band will be issued. This wrist band must be securely worn when entering the ring as proof of compliance with the conditions described in the Indemnity and Waiver. No person shall enter the Bicentennial Equestrian Park competition arena or the Camden Show Main Arena without a wrist band on Friday or Saturday. Any person entering these areas without a wristband will be asked to leave the arena immediately. If they are currently in control of a horse they will be asked to remove the horse from the arena unless they correctly complete and sign a Participants Indemnity and Waiver form. Horses must not be tied to the arena fences. All handlers must be on the same side of the fence as the horse. If the handler is not in possession of a wristband the horse and handler will be escorted from the arena by a Steward.

Schedule and operation of multiple arenas there are likely to be clashes between some classes. We are aware of these and every endeavour has been made to eliminate them, where possible. However, due to horses having multiple registrations and the fact that with up to 9 rings in operation across multiple arenas many classes are run at the same time, it is not possible to eliminate all class clashes. Therefore, where these occur, the Exhibitor may have to make a choice between one class and the other. Your cooperation will be much appreciated.

Marshalling: Competitors for all events are to assemble in the designated

Clashes: Please be aware that due to the complicated nature of the Horse

marshalling. Competitors for all events are to assemble in the designated marshalling yards and are only permitted to enter the ring once their event/class is called. When judging is complete competitors MUST leave the ring in an orderly manner. Please be advised that no events/classes will be held in order to allow competitors to complete an event in another ring. It is the responsibility of all competitors to read the schedule and understand the timing and location of their events/classes, and to make themselves aware of the progress of each ring, in order for them to be prepared for their event when it is called.

Health/Fitness of Horses: The Camden Show Society Inc. and our Honorary Veterinarian, reserves the right to inspect all horses upon entering the Show on arrival or whilst on the grounds. All horses deemed unfit by the Ring Master or the Honorary Veterinarian for competition will be withdrawn from the event. The Camden Show Society Inc. reserves the right to refuse entry and/or remove from the ring any horse that is diseased/injured/lame/unfit or distressed. Animals demonstrating clinical signs of contagious disease, overt lameness or in a compromised state will be excluded from the Show.

Horse - Welfare: (a) The welfare of Horse Exhibits at the Camden Show is of major importance to the Camden Show Society Inc. (CSS) and will be a prime consideration in all circumstances. Accordingly, in order to ensure the welfare of Exhibits whilst at the Camden Show, the CSS reserves the right in its absolute discretion to take such action as the Honorary Veterinary Surgeon (University Of Sydney Vet Centre) may advise in relation to any horse Exhibit including without limitation:

(b) The Exhibitor of an Exhibit referred to in paragraph (a) of this Regulation indemnifies the CSS in respect of all costs incurred by the CSS in connection with

Veterinarian to humanely euthanize the Exhibit.

- any action taken pursuant to paragraph (a).

 Cruelty To Horses: (a) No Exhibitor shall engage or be knowingly involved in cruelty to a horse. The CSS shall be the sole Judge of what constitutes cruelty.
- but it may include:

 i. To whip or beat a horse excessively,
- ii. To subject a horse to any kind of electric shock,
- iii. To use spurs, or to jab the horse in the mouth with the bit, excessively or
- persistently,
 iv. To remount, or attempt to remount, an exhausted, lame or injured horse,
- vi. To hypersensitise any part of a horse,
- vii. To leave a horse without adequate food, drink or exercise,

more than 7 days after the occurrence will not be considered.

- viii. Excessive exercise.
- ix. Tongues may not be tied in any manner.
- (b) Any case of cruelty must be reported immediately to the Chairman of the Horse Committee, accompanied by documentary evidence in support. Reports

Drugs/Prohibited Substances: All horses must perform at the time of competition, without the aid of any drug/s or prohibited substance/s that affect the conduct, performance, or appearance of the horse. The Camden Show Society Inc. reserves the right to test and inspect any horse for drugs or prohibitive substances. Horses may be selected at random or specifically tested if they Exhibit symptoms associated with drugs or prohibited substances. Defiance/breach of this rule or use of a banned substance will result in the

horse/competitor being excluded from the Show and notification of breach will be forwarded to the relevant Breed Society and the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW/Royal Agricultural Society of NSW. Please refer to the ASC webpage for

Honorary Veterinarian: The Honorary Veterinarian will be available on the grounds for emergency and first aid care to livestock which may become injured or suffer illness at the Show while competing, however please note that they reserve

suffer illness at the Snow while competing, nowever please note that they reserve the right to charge for veterinary services. **Approaching Judges:** No Exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a

Judge on judging day, before, during or after judging except through the Ringmaster or Chief Steward.

Prohibited Relationship: No competitor will present for judging before a Judge with whom he/she has a family relationship, has or has recently had a personal relationship or has had horse related business dealings during the past twelve months.

Coaching: Any person detected coaching a competitor while that competitor is being judged may be removed from the Showground.

Helmets: NO HELMET, NO RIDE. - Camden Show Society reserves the right to check helmets at any time. All persons riding a horse must wear approved safety helmets to the current Australian, European, British or American standard whilst mounted including but not limited to competition and exercise arenas (unless otherwise specified), unless specifically competing in an event in which the accepted dress code requires otherwise. The restraining helmet harness must be secured and fastened at all times. Riders are to understand that their EFA or UPWBDA Ltd Members Insurance may be rendered void in the event of an accident/injury, wherever it may occur, if found to have not been using an approved helmet. Subject to accepted Dress code potential competitors will NOT be allowed to ride if not wearing an approved helmet. Helmets over 5 years old CANNOT be worn. Helmets must conform with one of the current approved safety standards as follows - Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked or New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked or Current American standard ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked or Current American standard SNELL E2001 or Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked or Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040: 2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.

Heeled Boots: must be worn in all riding events.

Footwear: All competitors must wear appropriate footwear when leading or riding

Show Horse Council of Australasia Inc. Competition Rules February 2017 Edition unless otherwise specified by the individual breed competition requirements. These rules are available on www.showhorsecouncilaust.com.au. It is the responsibility of the competitor to read and abide by the dress requirements stated in this document. The Camden Show Society Inc. reserves the right to preclude any competitor not suitably attired.

Equipment: Whips, Snaffle Bits & Spurs Any equipment used must be acceptable according to the applicable competition rules for that class.

Whips: Whips in ridden classes shall not exceed 77cm in total length, except in Showjumping where EA Regulations will be enforced. The length includes the flap. This excludes Ridden Heavy Horse Classes.

Spurs: Spurs which are capable of wounding a horse are forbidden, rowels must be blunted. There must be a shank not exceeding 4cm in length pointing only towards the rear.

Bits: All Ridden & Harness Horses must be shown in a bit except where otherwise stated in the Camden Show Horse Schedule. Only snaffle bits having the following features are approved for use in Classes specifying the use of snaffle bits. Snaffle bits shall be composed of: i) metal; or ii) metal and rubber (flexible rubber bits are not permitted); or iii) metal and synthetic material. iv) Snaffle bits made only of metal must meet the following: v) all parts of the bit coming into the horse's mouth must be of metal (not necessarily the same metal); vi) the diameter of the mouthpiece of both the snaffle bit must be such so as not to hurt the horse; vii) mouthpieces may be the same thickness or tapered towards the centre of central joints; viii) all parts coming into the horse's mouth shall be rounded, smooth and not ridged, sharp or corrugated. ix) keeping with the definition above, also

permitted x) half-moon - port-mouth - curved xi) rubber or synthetic bit - both

jointed and unjoined xii) sweet iron bit.

Beginner: A Competitor who is not confident enough to compete as a novice competitor. Beginners may be led at the discretion of the Judge. If a Judge decides that a novice Competitor is not competent to compete in novice classes, the competitor may be asked to compete in a beginner class if a suitable class exists and has not been completed at that time.

Novice: A competitor who has NOT won an individual first prize in a solo event at an Agricultural Show.

Intermediate: A competitor who has NOT won an individual first, second or third prize in an event at a Royal Show.

Championships: Only winners of classes are eligible to compete for championships.

Supreme: Only winners of Champion sashes are eligible to compete for Supreme Championships.

Consolation: Only open to entries that have not individually won a first, second or third prize in this year's Camden Show.

Stallions: Colts and stallions must be shown in suitable headgear as governed by their respective breed societies. All Stallions and Colts one year old and over brought into the ring for led classes must be in the charge of a competent handler, and must be properly controlled, with a suitable restraining bit in their mouth and wearing head gear of proper strength and quality which is in use. No person under 17 years of age (proof of age may be requested) is permitted to show a colt or stallion in any led/ridden or harness class. Stallions and Colts shall only compete in classes where specifically permitted.

Hunters/Hacks: Ponies or Horses must nominate in either Show Hunter Classes or Hack Classes. Ponies or Horses are not eligible to compete in both classes. **Breed Classes:** Horses in breed classes must be registered with their respective Breed Society. Therefore, unregistered horses are not eligible for competition in these events. Copies of current registration must be available for presentation if requested by the Steward/Ring Master. All breed classes will be run according to the rules and regulations of their Society.

District Events: Only Horses & Rider Combinations who commonly reside in the Municipalities of Camden, Campbelltown and the Shire of Wollondilly are eligible to compete in District Events.

Pony Club Events: Only competitors who are members of Pony Clubs that operate within the Municipalities of Camden, Campbelltown and the Shire of Wollondilly shall be eligible to compete in the Pony Club Events. If a competitor resides outside of the district but is a member of a District Pony Club, they may compete in Pony Club Events but not in District Events.

Measuring: It is the responsibility of the Competitor to ensure their horse is entered in their correct height class. If there is a dispute in a height class, Stewards may request a measuring check through the Ring Master. Horses will be measured on protest being lodged unless they are in possession of a current measuring card issued by the EFA or Hack Council.

Horse Stalls: Electric fences are not permitted anywhere on the Show grounds at any time. Horse yards are available on the Bicentennial Equestrian Park for competitors and are allocated on a first come first served basis. Yards are to be cleaned, and all bedding, feed and manure is to be raked onto the grass adjacent to the yards after use.

This is an interim measure while we are not being charged by the BEP for use of the stalls. There is a penalty for us if the stalls are not cleaned which will be dealt with by the horse committee but in future years it is likely that a cleaning deposit and fee for use system using nominate will be used.

Temporary Yards: Yards erected overnight by Exhibitors in parking areas must be dismantled by 7:00 am each day. Electric fences are not permitted.

Fireworks & Night Show: Please note that there will be a fireworks display on Saturday night. Exhibitors with horses that may be distressed by these activities should remove their Exhibits prior to the night Show. The Camden Show Society Inc. accepts NO responsibility for any injury, death, loss to any person (competitor or spectator), livestock or property that may occur during the course of this event.

Grand Parade: The Grand Parade will be held on Saturday at approx. 4:00 pm. All ribbon winners are obliged to enter the parade as a condition of entry to the Show. Failure to take part may result in loss of Prize money and placing. **Amateur Rider:** Must never have received any form of payment for training or

riding another horse or pony. To be eligible rider must own their Exhibit.

Leaving The Ring: If a led horse should drag or escape its handler or a ridden or driven horse take control of or unseat its rider and/or leave the ring, it is usually disqualified from the class.

Ringmaster: The word Ringmaster includes the Ringmaster, any deputy or assistant Ringmaster and any person for the time being exercising some or all of the functions of the Ringmaster. A determination by the Ringmaster on any question or dispute arising in or incidental to the conduct of the ring or the conduct of any Competition, Parade, Exhibition or event or as to the action of any Exhibit or Exhibitor or Competitor or as to the proper describing of anything whether animate or inanimate shall be final and binding upon all Exhibitors.

Protests: Any Exhibitor who desires to enter a protest against any decision on the

part of the Judge, or any decision or act or omission on the part of the Society, shall lodge a protest in writing within 60 minutes on the <u>day</u> upon which such decision, act or omission occurred. The protest shall set out in detail the circumstances relied upon by such Exhibitor, shall be given to or left at the Secretary's Office accompanied by a fee of \$50.00, which shall be forfeited to the Society should the protest be deemed frivolous. Protests may be made by the owner, Exhibitor or their agent. All protests will be heard by the Protests committee & their decision is final & binding.

Judging: The committee reserves the right to substitute a Judge when it is deemed necessary. If a Judge shall consider that any Exhibit does not possess sufficient merit to deserve a prize, no Prize shall be awarded. The Judge in consultation with the Ring Master may at their discretion alter or vary the program as deemed necessary.

<u>Judges Decision Is Final:</u> The Committee of the Camden Show Society wishes to thank all those who support the Camden Show in any way - we ask that you support those who donate prizes or trophies to make this day a success.

The Horse committee reserves the right to make changes, please check the website at www.camdenshow.com for the most current schedule.

The Show reserves the right to test Show Exhibits for prohibited substances.
