- **Exhibit Delivery Times** – All Exhibits must be delivered to the Stewards at the Produce Pavilion with a copy of the Entry Receipt during the following times:
 - 5:00 pm – 8:00 pm Wednesday 2nd April 2025 and
 - 7:30 am – 8:30 am Thursday 3rd April 2025
- **Judging:** Commences 9:00 am Thursday 3rd April 2025 Exhibits tabled after the above times will not be accepted. Exhibitors shall accept the decision of the Judge. Judges are appointed by the Produce Subcommittee of the Society. Only authorised persons shall be allowed in the vicinity of the judges whilst judging. The Judge will only award prizes to Exhibits which are considered to possess sufficient merit. Stewards reserve the right to reject any Exhibit as “not per schedule”. The Most Successful Exhibitor must be chosen from prize winners. Points to determine the Most Successful Exhibitor overall are awarded as follows: 3 points for a Best Exhibit, 3 points for a Champion, 3 points for 1st, 2 points for 2nd, 1 point for 3rd. In the event of a tie, the winner is the one with the most 1st prizes.
- **Exhibit Collection Time:** Produce Pavilion Sunday 6th April 2025 9:00 am to 10:00 am. No responsibility is taken for Exhibits not collected by 10:00 am Sunday 6th April 2025 unless by prior arrangement Tony Biffin 0413 088 007. **Please make sure you bring your Entry Receipt for collection of Exhibits.**
- **Special Regulations:**
All Exhibits to be production of the Exhibitor under a penalty of being disqualified to compete for any of the Society’s prizes. If any exhibit is objected to on the grounds of not having been grown by the Exhibitor, satisfactory evidence must be furnished by the Exhibitor. All entries in Produce are to have been harvested during the previous 12 months. No descriptive tickets or advertising cards to be placed on Exhibits until after the Judges have made their decisions
